Day camp is a time for Packs to come together during the summer and participate in a variety of activities. Plan on having a FANTASTIC time as we learn Cub Scout Core Values. We'll make crafts, play games, shoot BB guns and practice Archery, and learn about teamwork and good sportsmanship, along with good manners and citizenship. Camp will be at the **Bolivar Knights of Columbus Building**, Thursday – Saturday, 9:00am–4:30pm. Webelos Overnighter on Friday Night and Closing Program on Saturday starting at 3:00pm, parents are invited to attend.

Cost to attend day camp is \$25 if you register AND pay before May 1st. Adult Volunteers, Tiger Cub Partners, Staff, Den Chiefs (must be at least 14) \$10. Boy Scouts, Scoutmasters and Webelos Parents only coming Friday night \$5.00. Late Registrations will be accepted until May 15th - Cub Scout \$30.00 & Adults \$15. All on time registrations will receive a t-shirt and patch. Everyone must turn in a registration form and a physical health form. Non-Registered Adults must complete a NON-Registered BSA Form. Cub Scouts and their parents need to read, review and sign the Rules of the Shooting Range and turn in with registration. Any Tiger Cub (any boy going into 1st grade) will need an adult partner every day. Please be sure to mark that you are a Tiger Partner so you can be place in the Tiger Den with your Tiger Scout. Walking Den Leaders (WDL) is asked to be BSA Registered with Youth Protection Training. We encourage Packs to bring at least 2 Walking Den Leaders for their Unit.

***Everyone at camp must wear camp shirt, wrist band, and bring a bottle of water every day. No open toe shoes or crocs allowed.

Lunch /snacks provided. Webelos Overnighter dinner/breakfast provided.

Webelos will be camping overnight Friday night. They must be accompanied by an adult. Standard Webelos camping gear is needed, adults are asked to bring a tent. Cooking gear, food and tents will be provided for Webelos. Webelos will be split into Patrols and will be under the direction of a Boy Scout and will pitch a tent and cook meals with their Patrol.

ARCHERY RANGE RULES

- All spectators and boys waiting to shoot must remain behind the waiting line and at least three yards behind the shooting line.
- Archers must wear close toe shoes on the range at all times.
- Archers may not allow anyone to hold a target for them.
- Archers must not talk or disturb shooters on either side when they are shooting.
- Archers stay on the shooting line until their target partners have shot their last arrows and then both step back together.
- No running is allowed on the ranges at any time.
- All commands issued by the range officer must be obeyed immediately.
- Stay behind the firing line. Do not straddle the firing line. Do not reach for objects that fall beyond the firing line.
- Bowes will be placed on ground quivers when shooting has ceased or when retrieving arrows. No bows may be carried to the target butts.
- Do not pick up a bow or nock an arrow unless told to do so by the range officer.
- No horseplay or unnecessary talking on the range
- If in doubt about these rules ask your leader or range officer for advice and help.

This form must be signed by both parent and Cub Scout, and submitted to the Day Camp with registration form. Any Cub Scout not having a form on file will not be allowed to participate in archery. Parents please make sure that you have reviewed the rules thoroughly with your son. Understand that every Cub Scout will receive rule training before being allowed to participate in event.

BB RANGE RULES

RULES OF THE RANGE:

- Keep rifles pointed in a safe direction at all times.
- Keep fingers outside the trigger guard until ready to shoot.
- Check the chamber whenever you handle the gun.
- Holding the gun, shooting prone
- Using the sights
- Pulling the trigger
- Follow through

RANGE PROCEDURE IS:

- A. RANGE IS CLEAR (all riffles unloaded and broken open at stations)
- B. SHOOTERS TO THE LINE (Teams come forward and meet range officers and put on eye protections.
- C. SIGN YOU TAGETS
- D. CLEAR THE RANGE
- E. RNAGE IS CLEAR. YOU ARE FREE TO LOAD AND FIRE.
- F. TWO MINUTE WARNING.
- G. TIME FIRE. FIRE YOUR LAST SHOT.
- H. LINE IS CLEAR. (all riffles unloaded and broken open)
- I. RANGE OFFICERS FORWARD TO COLLECT TARGETS.
- J. SHOOTERS LEAVE YOUR EYE PROTECTION AT THE LINE.

This form must be signed by parent and Cub Scout, and submitted to Day Camp with registration form. If form is not on file Cub Scout will not be allowed to shoot BB's. Parents, please make sure that you have reviewed the rules thoroughly with your son. The Range Officer will take time explaining the rules before the Cub Scout is allowed to shoot.
