People

There are 3,660 Volunteers, 11 Council Field Staff, 8 Support Staff, and 2 camp Rangers providing a program for 8,641 children and young adults here in the Ozark Trails Council. We have 4 major camping facilities totaling 2,688 acres and an annual budget of \$ 2,063,204. These people and dollars provide support for 404 Scouting units chartered to over 300 chartered partners; churches, community service organizations, businesses, schools, etc.. Our Scouting effort here in Southern Missouri and South East Kansas covers a total of 12,301 people. The average registered member experiences about 130 hours of Scouting each year. This comes out to 1,599,130 hours of Scouting. This includes den and pack meetings, day camps, Cub Scout resident camp, field trips, pinewood derby races, Scout Troop meetings, week end camp outs, summer camp, high adventure trips, camporees, Klondike derby events, merit badges, Venture meetings, community service projects, like Scouting for Food, and lots more fun filled activities that are part of America's premier youth program. Scouting is a fun-filled, outdoor educational experience that builds character and self-esteem in our youth while teaching them the leadership and social skills they will need to reach their full life's potential. Every one of these numbers represent a person, someone who participates and benefits from this great program. It is the combination of great volunteers, dedicated staff, and quality chartered partners that make all this happen.

Thank you all for making this great program a reality for thousands of children here in the 31 county service area of the Ozark Trails Council service area.

CAMP ARROWHEAD



The Ozark Trails Council operates Camp Arrowhead, the oldest continuously operating Boy Scout Camp West of the Mississippi River. Camp Arrowhead offers programs for all Scouts, from the first-year Trailblazer Program, to High Adventure activities for older Scouts

Camp Arrowhead is situated on over 600 beautiful wooded acres in the Ozark Mountains near Marshfield in Southwest Missouri. The property features Lake Osage, miles of hiking and biking trails, caves, a spring and many examples of native Missouri plants and wildlife.

Scouts attending Camp Arrowhead can enjoy traditional outdoor Scouting activities; backpacking, hiking, fishing, swimming, archery, trap-shooting, rifle shooting, as well as more challenging adventure and aquatics programs. These include: Mountain bikes, canoeing, small boat sailing, rappelling, Project C.O.P.E, and mountain boarding.

The purpose of Camp Arrowhead is to provide Scouting experiences that strengthen your troop operation by supporting the efforts of your unit leaders-both youth and adult-and by fulfilling the promise of Scouting in the outdoors.

Camp Arrowhead provides nationally-accredited camp facilities, staff, and programs for the use of Scouting. Camp staff and facilities are resources to assist you in achieving your troop goals.

Council Resources

- 1 Accident Insurance:** A council policy providing coverage for all registered youth and adults, for medical expenses resulting from injury while participating in Scouting activities. (for details contact the Council office)
- 2 Activities Committee:** Supports unit by planning, promoting, and operating multi-unit events that supplement but do not replace unit programs: Camporalls, Scouting for Food, and Scout Shows.
- 3 Advancement Committee:** Educates Scouters in and maintains the policies, procedures, and philosophy of Scouting's Advancement program.
- 4 Anniversary Week:** An annual activity that marks the founding of the Boy Scouts of America.
- 5 Annual Planning Conference:** A meeting of all the unit's leaders to plan the unit's program for the year.
- 6 Annual Scouter Recognition Dinner:** A Council or District event designed to salute volunteer service to Scouting.
- 7 Annual Planning Chart:** used by units to plan their year round program.
- 8 Audio Visual Library:** Films, slides, video, and audio tapes, projectors and VCR/TVs, used in training and guiding volunteers. These can be checked out with a \$5.00 deposit for tapes.
- 9 Boy Scout Leader Specific Training:** A comprehensive training experience that provides an orientation to: Boy Scouting, the patrol method, developing boy leaders, advancement and personal growth, youth protection, troop operation and administration, troop program planning and the outdoor program.
- 10 Boys' Life Magazine:** The magazine published by the BSA for boys 6-18. It is an important part of successful Scouting. It gives a boy a sense of belonging to a national organization, helps him live Scouting, can increase his enthusiasm for Scouting, improves reading skills, and is FUN.
- 11 Junior Leader Training Conference:** A seven day training program for older Scouts designed to strengthen both Leadership and Scoutcraft Skills.
- 12 Camping Committee:** Plans, promotes, and administers Scouting's outdoor program and properties for the benefit of the units and their youth members.
- 13 Camporee:** A district event where troops come together to camp, have fellowship, learn, and demonstrate Scouting skills and compete with other troops.

- 14 **Camporall:** A council-wide camporee.
- 15 **Career Interest Survey:** A survey of 8th-11th graders, asking their 1st & 2nd choice of career interest as well as hobby choices. The results are used in the establishment of new Explorer Posts.
- 16 **Charter Review Meetings:** A step in the rechartering procedure. A meeting of representatives of the unit committee, unit chartered partner, and the council, to review the past year and plan the future.
- 17 **C.O.P.E.:** The Challenging Outdoor Physical Experience is dedicated to giving the older Scout or Explorer something special. This program is for those 14 years or older. Participants will learn: leadership skills, teamwork, and responsibility in practical, hands-on, challenging situations.
- 18 **Cub Scout Leader Specific Training:** Teaches Cub Leaders the objectives and methods of the Cub Scout program that will make it possible for them to be truly effective as they work with boys and parents in the den and pack.
- 19 **Cub Scout Day Camp:** A fun filled activity for Cub Scouts, 3-4 day program, run by district volunteers under the guidance of the council.
- 20 **Cub Leader's Pow-Wow:** An annual day-long carnival of program ideas, stunts, skits, ceremonies, puppets, and crafts. All Cub Scout adults invited.
- 21 **Den Chief Training Conference:** An event full of fun, excitement, and information to train Den Chiefs to more effectively working with the Cub Scout Den and to train Den Leaders how to use Den Chiefs.
- 22 **Exploring Firstnighter:** An event hosted by an Explorer Post to invite prospective youth members and their parents to learn about the post program, activities, and joining requirements. Also, to register those wishing to join.
- 23 **Explorer Leader Basic Training:** Designed to assist adults to provide a balanced quality program to youth. It consists of these sessions: "The Exploring Method, Unit Program Planning, and Post Program Support".
- 24 **Friends of Scouting:** An annual finance campaign that supports 25% of the council annual budget.
- 25 **High Adventure Base:** One of three national activity areas designed to provide pinnacle outdoor experiences planned and designed to meet the needs of older Boy Scouts and Explorers.
- 26 **Institutional Head Visit:** The Scouting professional annually visits the Chartered Organization Head.
- 27 **Jamboree:** A national or international encampment of Scouts & Leaders, providing a unique opportunity in life to share "Scouting at its best", with fellow Scouts. A National Jamboree draws from all over the USA and usually numbers over 35,000 youth, camping for a week.
- 28 **Liability Insurance:** Protection for Scouting Volunteers and

Chartered Organizations against claims that may arise as a result of Scouting activities. For details, contact the local service center.

- 29 **Membership Inventory:** Conducted in the fall to review a units membership roster and Boys' Life registration.
- 30 **Membership Registration:** The processing of all member applications and Boys' Life subscriptions. Individual membership cards are provided and unit charters are issued. Records are maintained in the council service center and the national office.
- 31 **Order of the Arrow:** Scouting's honor society which is youth run with support and guidance of selected adults.
- 32 **Post Officers' Seminar:** Training conducted by each post to orient new officers, plan programs, and develop the annual activities schedule.
- 33 **POW-WOW:** A funfilled training experience for all adults in Cub Scouting. An opportunity through hands-on experience to prepare leaders to carry out their jobs with competence and satisfaction.
- 34 **Roundtable:** A district monthly gathering of Cub Scout, Boy Scout, & Varsity leaders that provides an opportunity to gain information, inspiration, program ideas, and share experiences with other leaders.
- 35 **Safe Swim Defense:** An 8-point plan for operation of a safe unit swim. All Scout swimming activities must follow this plan.
- 36 **Safety Afloat:** Required plan of operation for safe boating during a Scouting activity.
- 37 **School Night:** A Scouting program conducted in cooperation with educators to inform youth and their parents about the Scouting program in their neighborhood, and to invite them to join Scouting.
- 38 **Summertime Pack Award:** Encourages and recognizes packs that conduct monthly activities in June, July, and August. Packs active in the summer get started in the fall easier and quicker.
- 39 **Scout Open Houses:** A troop meeting during which prospective youth and their parents are invited to join Scouting.
- 40 **Scouting for Food:** A good turn coordinated with local food banks to provide an opportunity for Scouts to fight hunger by distributing bags and collecting those same bags a week later with food in them to go to the food banks.
- 41 **The Scouter:** The monthly newsletter used to inform and recognize volunteers. It is the primary means of communication in the Ozark Trails Council.
- 42 **Training Committee:** Plans and implements an effective year-round leadership training program for volunteers.
- 43 **Tour Permit:** A planning tool to help units prepare for safe trips, required for all unit trips.
- 44 **Unit Fund Raising Application:** A required tool to assure

proper planning, notification, and communication of your unit's fundraising events; submitted for prior approval to the council.

45 **University of Scouting:** This is exciting one-day event for all Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Venturing and adult leaders. It is an opportunity to learn new ideas from fantastic instructors and enjoy the fellowship of other adult volunteers and talented youth leaders from all over the council. A single day packed with a year's worth of information for adults who want to provide the best program possible for their Scouts. In addition to the many classes and resources this event provides, participants have a chance to meet leaders from all over the Ozark Trails Council area.

Training will help you accomplish these goals, plus provide you with resources, ideas and fellowship.

So how can you find this information? We're offering a lot of new and exciting training - when you need it and where you need it. You don't have to attend the training in your own district. Training is standardized across the council, so no matter where or when you take it, you'll receive the same excellent course. So, check the Council calendar to find a session that fits your schedule, and take it NOW!

Courses are offered both by individual districts, and at the Council level. If your district does not have a convenient training session, please consider attending the course in another district.

Cub Scout leaders are considered trained when they have completed Cub Scout Fast Start, Youth Protection, This is Scouting, and the Cub Scout Leader Specific Training for their position.

Scoutmasters and assistant Scoutmasters are considered trained when they have completed Boy Scout Fast Start, Youth Protection, This is Scouting, Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Leader Specific Training, and Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills.

Troop committee members are considered trained when they have completed Boy Scout Fast Start, Youth Protection, This is Scouting, and the Troop Committee Challenge.

Varsity Scout leaders and assistants are considered trained when they have completed Varsity Fast Start, Youth Protection, This is Scouting, Varsity Scout Leader Specific Training, and Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills.

Venturing crew Advisors, assistant Advisors and crew committee members are considered trained when they have completed Venturing Fast Start, Youth Protection, This is Scouting, and Venturing Leader Specific Training.

Tribe of Lone Bear

Lone Bear is a program that reinforces the Scout Oath and Law by asking Scouts and Scouters to rededicate themselves to those principles by making specific commitments. It serves a secondary purpose of encouraging older Scouts and Scouters to return to summer camp for more years. Lone Bear is modeled on the Tribe of Mic-O-Say in neighboring Scout councils. Members of Mic-O-Say may join Lone Bear at the station that they have attained in Mic-O-Say.

Lone Bear started in Ozark Trails Council with a Chieftains' ceremony on July 11, 2000. The first Scouts were called and inducted into the Tribe at Camp Arrowhead in 2001. Lone Bear is governed by the Council of Chieftains, which sets policy for the program. The Scout Executive is the directing chief of the tribe. A volunteer Scouter is presiding chieftain and presides at ceremonies and Council of Chieftain meetings. The Tribal Council carries out the policies set by the Council of Chieftains and runs the program and ceremonies at camp. Tribal Council members are longtime Scouters and older camp staff members. Specific requirements for membership in Lone Bear are sent each spring to the Scoutmasters of troops that are signed up for Camp Arrowhead. Troop committees approve recommendations for Scouts and Scouters to join the tribe. Recommendation forms for new members and tribal advancements are turned in on the first day of the camping session that a troop attends.

Each rank of Lone Bear includes a specific symbol worn on a lanyard around the neck. A Foxman wears a wooden, four-colored stick. A Brave wears a single Eagle claw and a leather pouch. Hardway Warriors (who entered the Tribe as youth) wear two Eagle claws back-to-back. Honorary Warriors and Honored Women wear two Eagle claws in the shape of a half moon. Extra responsibility after the rank of Warrior is designated by paint on claw tips. Different shapes and colors of beads on Warrior lanyards above the claws designate tenure in the tribe, service on camp staff and other recognitions.
